IMPACT OF PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY 2015-2016

Analysis of Pupil Premium Outcomes in 2016 Statutory Tests:

EYFS children achieving a Good Level of Development

- The attainment for our Pupil Premium children was in- line with national attainment of this group.
- The in school gap between Pupil Premium children and others was smaller than that nationally.

Y6 children achieving the Expected Standard at end of KS2

| Reading | 41% | 58% |
| Writing | 82% | 81% |
| Maths | 47% | 38% |
| Reading, Writing & Maths | 35% | 38% |

- The proportion of our Pupil Premium children meeting the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths was in-line with the same group nationally.
- The gap between Pupil Premium children and others in the school was narrower than that found nationally.

- Progress from KS1 baseline was better in all subjects for Pupil Premium children than it was for others nationally. It was significantly better in Reading.
