Can you draw a picture of the Woolly Mammoth doing an activity that could have made him dirty and smelly?		Talk to your adult to discuss your favourite part of this weeks' story.	Practice running your own bath or shower with your adult. Get yourself undressed and dressed all by yourself.
This week we are thinking about instructions. Can you follow instructions given by an adult or sibling? Maybe you could make a drink/tie a lace/bake a cake/turn on the tv and find a programme whilst following spoken instructions? Can you spot the woolly mammoth?	Woolly Mammoths were very slow and very heavy. Can you move like a mammoth? Can you pretend to push and shove your mammoth into the bath? Can you shake like super soggy mammoth?	How do you feel about bath time? Do you like having a bath? Maybe you have a shower instead... What do you like to do whilst having a wash?	We know all the sounds we need to write the sentence: 'The mammoth has a wet bath.' Without cheating, can you write this sentence if your helper gives you one word at a time?
Can you think of 2 more steps to add to the guide for washing the Woolly Mammoth? What would you try to do to get him in the bath?
